The WSASCD-OSPI Conference Planning Committee is seeking concurrent session proposals for the 2011 Annual Conference. Individuals, schools, districts, and other educational institutions are invited to submit proposals for presentations related to the conference theme: **"Hope for Tomorrow: Change for Today."**

Conference Purposes

- To provide professional development and networking opportunities for all educators—preschool, elementary, secondary teachers and administrators, district-level administrators, and educators in higher education.
- To support the partnership and collaboration between Washington State ASCD and the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI).
- To foster the connection, through the exhibits, between educators and the businesses that support education.

What You Should Know

- The conference program will feature approximately 28 (1-1/2 hour) concurrent sessions during three different time blocks on **Friday, October 14, 2011**.
- **Note: Proposal Deadline is Friday, April 29, 2011.** Selection notifications will be made by May 28, 2011.
- No sales are allowed in concurrent session program, with the exception of our 'Special Product Showcase' sessions, which will be available to our Platinum Level Partners. Other companies with items to sell are welcome to purchase an exhibit booth.
- Presenters are responsible for expenses including travel, lodging, meals, handouts, and supplies. With regard to audio-visual equipment, we can provide a screen, TV w/VCR/DVD, chart paper and pens. We do not provide LCD projectors or document cameras.
- Presenters are expected to use engaging adult learning techniques.

Proposal Selection Criteria

Session proposals should relate to one or more of the following strands: *Powerful Instruction—Power Standards—Student Engagement; Future Innovative Learning Technologies; Examples of Hope—School Culture; Innovation—Creativity; Resiliency for Staff and/or Students; Data to Inform Instruction—Growing Assessment Literacy; College and Career Readiness for ALL Students; Cultural Competence—Evidence of the Work; Connecting Globally; Preparing Students for the Unknown—Teaching Thinking; Leading Change*

- Preference will be given to proposals that involve teams and/or students.
- Content may be applied with or without using a specific product or service. Proposals for the purpose of sales will not be accepted for regular concurrent sessions program.
- A balance of sessions will be selected that relate to the strands stated above, that reach a variety of intended audiences (i.e. preschool, elementary, secondary teachers and administrators; district-level administrators, and educators in higher education).

In Appreciation

- As a professional, non-profit organization, WSASCD is unable to provide presenters with an honorarium or reimburse participants for expenses. However, presenters, for each accepted session will have a complimentary registration for Friday. Non-members are expected to pay the \$50 membership. Presenters can attend the conference on Saturday for the posted registration fee. Membership does not apply to K-12 students.
